The Dam/Dredge Project Bobbi Coulter

There has been much progress on the Dam/Dredge project. The appropriation bill has passed both houses and has been signed into law by our governor. The loan rules and regulations have been amended; a vote to ratify them is due in a few weeks. I met with the town attorney and we're on track to have a resolution adopted by the town in July or August. We're hopeful that we can close on the loan in August.

Larry Bell, Chris Allyn and I met with our project engineer and attorney to review the contracts and bid packages that will be sent to contractors. We'll be sending these out to six to eight pre-qualified contractors within a week or two.

Terry Dwyer and Joan Fitzhugh have been preparing our own internal

Our Beach Carol Irving

Our lake can serve as a magnet for people who want to cool off on a hot day, but there is NO LIFE-GUARD and the lake is also a potential hazard for which we are all ultimately responsible.

Guests of children can be a special risk. There is often a strong desire to swim to the raft because "others are doing it". A child who is a "good swimmer" in a pool may panic when they suddenly realize that they are not within a few strokes of the pool's edge. They will not necessarily yell for help (they are too embarrassed), they iust start floundering and going under. I know. I have rescued two children in this situation, If your child has invited quests, you should be assuming responsibility for them.

Older teens present another problem. They may be strong swimmers and do not want to be seen with a parent. They should then realize that they are assuming responsibility for their guests' behavior. Make your older teens aware that they are defacto lifeguards and should enforce the basic rules of safety on the diving board, raft and in boats.

If residents and guests wear badges it is easier to identify uninvited or self invited guests. Please do your bit to help make the beach a safe place to swim.
