Lake Association Beaches

There was less algae growth this year, Allied Biological only treated the lake once. Anything left on the beach after September 30 will be put out for cleanup. Boats without names will be removed from the beach. (They may be reclaimed if you know who to ask and are willing to negotiate.)

House

The clubhouse was painted this summer and the ballroom floor was cleaned and sealed. Work was done on the back deck to bring it up to code. Many thanks to Guy Bowden for helping in buying the materials and supervising the workers.

Roads Some pothole repair was done this summer. Our township engineer, Paul Fox, was consulted and suggestions have been received on how to improve our roads. Work will continue next summer. The fall road clean-up will be on November 4. Leaves piled by the road will be picked up. Branches should be placed separately from the leaves. they will be chipped.

Grounds

Although contractors are hired for mowing, many people contribute in maintaining our grounds. Diane Bonar and Ken Heiden trimmed the bushes by intersections to improve visibility, George and Ellie Burd cared for the clubhouse planters and Ray and Theresa Jones assumed stewardship for the garden plot. Housekeeping An electric cooler was purchased which will eventually be installed behind the bar. This will eliminate the need to store wine and beer in the kitchen refrigerator. Newton White and Janet Neigel donated a refrigerator and freezer for the clubhouse basement.

Going Phosphorus Free Environmental Stewardship Committee

Dish washing detergent is a key contributor of phosphorus leaching into our lake. Phosphorus fuels algae bloom which leads to lake decay, aging and eutrophication, of a lake. Twenty years ago phosphorus was banned from laundry detergent but not from dishwashing detergent. Dishwashing detergent has eighteen times more phosphorus than laundry soap. Other key contributors to excess phosphorus are lawn fertilizers, animal waste washed down from yards and driveways, soil erosion and cleaning products. All these are within our control. Now that we have dredged the lake it is important to help MKL recover and stay healthy.

Trader Joe's sells a phosphorus-free dish washing soap. Shop Rite often sells some "green" products. Seventh Generation and Ecover Natural are two safe cleaning brands. If you can't find one, let Jane Kendall know and she will do a Trader Joe's run.

Dropped Cell Phone Calls
