Tennis anyone? In February??

You may have recently noticed work being done on the tennis court, starting with snow removal??? Last year over \$3,000 was donated by residents to begin a multi-year rehab of our tennis court. About \$2,000 was used, supplemented by the annual tennis court budget, to complete a number of upgrades, including an extensive rebuilding of the South end of the court plus stone curbing to eliminate wash out on that end. The ripped wind screen on the South end was replaced as well.

This year, because we are starting early, we got a great price on redoing the more seriously problematic North end of the court. Starting with the \$1,200 left over from last year and again using the tennis court budget, unchanged from last year, the North end of the court will be rebuilt from the base up. Curbing will be extended along the East side to better manage runoff and soft spots. A drinking fountain will be added outside the court for the convenience of users of the playground.

To complete these Improvements, an additional \$1,700 needs to be raised. The Tennis Committee consisting of Barbara McGoldrick and John Murray, report that \$1,000 has been pledged leaving just \$700 to be raised in the Spring.

The tennis committee is also looking for someone to give tennis lessons to MKL residents. If you are interested in enrolling your child or yourself in group lessons, please let Barb or John know
