### Road Repair and Upgrade Approved

At a special meeting of the Community in August a quorum of members agreed to finance a loan of up to \$200,000 to pay for the much-needed improvements to our roads. Work should begin soon in October, once the repairs are made to the water mains.

You will note that on your October Association bill you have the option to prepay the \$400/year assessment (continuing over the next 5 years) by paying the pro-rated amount of \$1,773 with your October bill (total: \$2,498). That takes \$200 off your Association dues bills for the next 5 years!

Thanks to Austin Godfrey and John Murray for presenting the issue to the community and for arranging the solution to the problem of our deteriorating roads.
