Deer Disease Hitting Local Herds

A disease (EHD) is affecting deer in our area, resulting in at least 3 dead or dying deer found at the Lake. The symptoms of Epizootic Hemorragic Disease are lethargy, high thirst, drooling, and shock. If you see an affected deer, call the Police Department if the animal is still alive or the Health Department if it is already dead. The disease is spread by the bite of a species of midge fly, which is likely to die off with the onset of colder weather. The midge bite doesn't infect humans and the
