


Fundraiser for Children's Cancer Fund

New Siphon for the Dam

Rick Barrett, Water Chair, reports that a new siphon for lowering the Lake has been installed and tested. The original outlet valves that served this purpose had failed (after more than 80 years of service) and could not be replaced. The siphon serves to control the Lake level to prevent a possible overtopping of the dam in the event of a sudden rise in water inflow from a storm.

Lake Stewardship Reminders

We all want to enjoy our Lake, especially in the summertime. But the health of the Lake is a year-round concern.

Septic system maintenance is crucial to prevent excessive nutrient flow into the lake. Systems should be cleaned out regularly per Township regulations. Avoid toxic chemical use and garbage disposal input which adversely affect septic systems.

Lawn maintenance should avoid using herbicides and pesticides that could flow into the Lake. Fertilizers that are phosphorousfree and have low-release nitrogen are preferable. Check with your lawn-maintenance contractors to prevent the use of products that could be harmful to our Lake.
