WATER SYSTEM UPDATE

Thank a VSA – Did you know? - That every day, of every month, all year long, one of your 20 neighbors checks the availability and quality of the water we use.

Volunteers Vital Statistics Auditors (VSAs) visit the water system pumphouse(s) daily to monitor the performance of the pumps and the chlorine levels of the water being distributed. If any of the measures are out of spec, notice is given to the Lakeshore Board people responsible and to the professional company that services the system (Agra), for immediate correction.

In the Summer, VSAs attended a once-a-year training update during which they were treated to a gourmet dinner as a "thank you" for their efforts on behalf of the community. This year's dinner was exceptional. MKL celebrity chefs, Bobbi Coulter and Carl Bonar served up a multi-course gourmet dinner. Thanks to both.

New Well Online - The new well installation (Well #4) was completed over the Summer and the well has been operational for over a month. Relatively new State regulations required that a "5 minute" contact loop be installed to thoroughly mix and distribute the chlorine that is injected into the water before it is distributed. The loop consists of 5 long, parallel connected pipes buried under the children's' playground. Well #1, located in the adjacent pumphouse, is also piped into the loop. Because of the multiple in and out pipes, access ports, injector ports, etc. the interior of the pumphouse looks like a mad scientist's dream lab. But it works and it works well (sorry). Next up is to assess the feasibility of reactivating Well #2 (by the breeder pond) as a permitted backup. For now it is only state-permitted as a "boil water notice" back up.

The path to this significant accomplishment has been tortuous to say the least, with many moving parts; changing State regulations, multiple NJ State departments, numerous reports and onsite visits by regulators. But the result is an indisputably high quality/quantity water system that will serve the community well (sorry again) for a long time.

Special thanks go to Rick Barrett who has stuck with and guided this project for almost 3 years. learning way more about bureaucracy than he ever wanted to.
