We will try to schedule this in the 2017 budget. The cost for a new pump 10 years ago was \$8000. The group also seems to favor low cost circulation pumps in the tanks. We need to find out what it will entail to bring electricity up to tanks. The old electric line has been compromised. A water leak by the Dupre House was dug up and repaired.

More than Thirty people participated in road clean up. Bob Edgar and Bill Haynsworth did a tremendous Job using Bob's trailer. Carl and kitchen workers made a delicious lunch. Thank you to everyone. We worked on the beach parking lot and cleaned up the tennis court Ken planted grass seed by beach and by tanks but it was too wet for road work. We are waiting for Backshall to bring stone to fill along the side of some of the roads

David and Rich Kenworthy, of Alward Inc., described to Ken how they will repair the problem areas by milling and applying a thin coat of asphalt. The problem areas also include the parking lot.

Alex Baydin is comfortable with the proposed re-alignment. He asked if his mailbox could be moved to the other side of his driveway.

In response to the initial LRCP roads report, Ken interviewed two paving experts: Tracy Toribio, supervisor of Harding DPW, and our neighbor Nick Stires, P.E., VP of Operations for Pave-Rite, Inc., of Bridgewater and found differing opinions. Both held a low opinion of slurry sealing; Tracy calling it "a bad paint job" and Nick saying he would only use it on driveways. Both Tracy and Nick said that seam seal is only needed for cracks wider than one-half inch. Tracy was emphatic about the need to seal roads but he will only use chip-sealing (tar and gravel). He said every road in Harding will be chip-sealed every 5-7 years. Ken intends to follow the same procedure the town does which is to patch, mill where necessary, and chip-seal on a regular basis. At the annual meeting \$40,000 was approved for chip-sealing this year however there will be more investigation by the board prior to spending the money.

TREASURER- Bobbi C. Coulter [mkltreasurer@gmail.com] Barbara passed out the monthly reports which can also be found on the Mount Kemble Web site.

Thanks to the help of Bob Edgar Lee Irwin from the tax collector's office in Kennelon has agreed to take over collections of Dues for the MKL Association. We sent an

engagement letter paying \$20 per hr. with a cap of \$1,200 per year. The hourly rate will go up to \$25 per hour if it all works out.. A note will go out with the next dues statement. New Business:

There is not sufficient parking on the lake side of Lake Trail East, it will make it more difficult for the snow plows and emergency vehicles creating a hazard condition.
