Robert Ray Plum, 62, died Wednesday, August 13, 2014 at Morristown Memorial Hospital as a result of a heart attack. He was born in Morristown on August 20, 1951 and lived in the community since his graduation from Moravian College in 1974. Robert also was a 1970 graduate of Storm King School in Cornwall-on-Hudson in New York. Robert's family has lived in Morristown for several generations.

Robert spent thirteen years as a sales account executive with SPS Strategic Products and Services in Parsippany and fifteen years as a service advisor with Royal Cadillac in Florham Park.
